Regulations

IACSD standards for Conscious Sedation in the Provision of Dental Care 2015 who state:

"Practitioners must be able to provide age-appropriate immediate life support as defined by the main elements of the Resuscitation Council (UK) ILS and PILS training programmes.

It is not essential to undertake a Resuscitation Council (UK) accredited ILS/PILS course.

Alternative courses with equivalent content which are adapted to the needs of dental practice are acceptable: these might also include the management of common sedation, medical and dental emergencies."





Training Providers

- Ensure that the course provider covers the equivalent content of an ILS
 - Medical Emergencies scenarios are a good way to learn

 AGE APPROPRIATE – if treating children there should be child based scenarios

• Basic Life Support is not enough for Conscious Sedation practitioners
